

## Literacy

In Literacy, the children will be developing their understanding of the 'Tragedy' plot structure. This will be achieved through studying William Shakespeare's Macbeth.

This well-known play will act as a model text that the children will use as their template when writing to persuade across this half term.

## Maths

The children will be moving on to new units of work involving decimals, percentages area, perimeter and volume and algebra. Children will learn to compare decimals and percentages in their first unit, building on their knowledge of fractions from earlier in the year. They will learn to find rules, create expressions and formulae and solve simple algebraic equations in their second unit.

## DT

Our theme this term will focus on preparing and cooking sweet dishes linked to Fairtrade. Children will follow a given recipe and understand the importance of Fairtrade and the ethical impact of where food comes from. Children will also measure accurately and calculate ratios of ingredients to scale up or down recipes.

# Tragedy

## Music

The children will be using 'Charanga' music software to listen and appraise a piece of music. We will be improvising with our own compositions and using our knowledge of rhythm notation to create different textures and timbres.

## Values

## PSHE

In PSHCE, the children will be exploring different ways of achieving and celebrating personal goals. This will involve studying a growth mindset, how to manage money and what enterprise means to the children. They will work in small business groups to complete Apprentice-style tasks.

## PE

The children will improve and develop their confidence in playing a range of invasion games this half term. This will involve building on their teamwork skills, passing and moving within a game and using tactics to their advantage to defeat an opponent.

## Geography

The children will be working on the concept of fair trade and investigating trade links between regions, countries and the wider world. Children will explore the impact that the *Silk Road* has had on trade and think about more locally manufactured products and how they are exported.
